

"That's putting it lightly. I had to duck in the guest room to keep from getting trampled in the hall."






"I know," Ginger said.

"Me too!" Cubby exclaimed.







Danielle said she really shouldn't since she was pressed for time, but she decided to stop just for a second to see the eagles. The puppies were so excited to get out and walk down to the river.






"There's two eagles over there!" Cubby woofed, climbing up on a log. "Careful, Cubby, don't fall in," Ginger woofed. "I know. l know."














"Yeah," Cubby agreed, as they all stared up to the sky. "Isn't it big... bigger than us." "That's true," Ginger agreed.

"I guess it has to do with love. I looked in the Bible this morning. It was open to a page with a list of Valentine's Day verses and they were all about love."


"Really? You should read them to me, so I know what this day's all about before the company arrives."








"No, you should read them," Ginger said. **"Remember how Mama** wanted you to learn to read. You haven't been doing it much."


"That means substitute," Ginger explained.

Ginger couldn't help noticing that one of the guys got an extra big portion.






After dinner, they all went into the living room to play a game.

"I'm ready!" Ginger woofed. "When's it my turn?" She watched everyone else take a turn. She hadn't written on hers, but she figured she could put it in blank.






She didn't mind waiting. She had fun watching everyone laughing and having a good time.
